#### **MODULE DESCRIPTION**

This learning module bridges elementary skills to pre-intermediate level and aims to develop students' English language proficiency through an integrated program of study. The module is defined within the Common European Framework and European Language Portfolio. Lessons focus on the development of reading, writing, listening, and speaking skills while giving systematic attention to grammar, course-related vocabulary and critical thinking activities that are integrated throughout each unit and help develop learners' independence. Active participation and language-use are crucial; therefore, learners must change their passive learning habits to be more active participants. Assessment is based on class participation, discussions, assignments, a quiz, a midterm test, and a final examination. Specific units are described in the scope and sequence on the following pages.

M4.	Develop increasing accuracy in using: (i) verb tenses; (ii) quantifiers; (iii) auxiliary verbs; (iv) adverbs, adjectives, articles, and prepositions.
M5.	Develop increasing ability in listening and speaking tasks at the pre-intermediate level.
M6.	Give simple opinions and express preferences related to familiar topics using basic fixed expressions.
M7.	Write short descriptive texts on familiar topics (e.g. spending free time, playing sports, travel plan with an itinerary, success).
M8	Predict meanings of unfamiliar words in familiar contexts using context clues.



M9	Use learned strategies to identify the topic, the main idea, and supporting details to interpret short narrative or descriptive passages on familiar topics.
M10	Build confidence in speaking English and doing a simple presentation.
