Description

This module, a continual of English Writing I, is designed to improve students' writing skills in English necessary for success at the college level, by focusing on reflective and expository writing. It consists of writing skills training in prewriting, drafting, editing, and revising. The students are also instructed in critical reading skills and in using course readings to analyze specific writing techniques and strategies that can be used to improve their own writing.

Learning Outcomes

By the end of this semester, students should be able to demonstrate proficiency in the following aspects:

- 1. Compose essays demonstrating proficiency in developing and organizing ideas, using language effectively, and writing in standard edited English;
- 2. Demonstrate continued use and development of effective writing strategies in prewriting, drafting, editing, and revising;
- 3. Write an appropriate introduction, thesis, development and conclusion in an essay;
- 4. Identify, describe, and develop a variety of exposition types, including narrative, descriptive, reflective, and analytical essays.

Content

Topic 1. Introduction

The students are to know the instructional objectives or goals, contents and schedules, teaching methods and materials of this module.

Topic 2. Review

The students learn to perform basic research on a given subject and properly utilize research in a written plan or outline.

Topic 3. Drafting – paragraphs and essays

The students practice on thesis statement and idea generation strategies and techniques and learn to produce a unified and supported essay.

Topic 4. Editing

The students learn to improve and refine sentence structure and language use, cohesion and coherence, unity and support of the writings.

Topic 5. Revising and evaluation

The students work in groups to identify individual writing challenges and to develop strategies to address those challenges, and track down their own progress in writing skills.

Topic 6. Finalizing

The students produce writings of at least two exposition types.

Lectures, in-class exercises & discussions, video-cued writing exercises, analysis of sample writings, self-review and peer-review, take-home assignments, quiz
