### **Description**

This module is designed to improve students' writing skills in English, by focusing on reflective and expository writing. It consists of two broad parts: firstly, the fundamental knowledge and understanding of written language (as opposed to spoken language), and secondly writing skills training in prewriting and drafting. The students are also instructed in critical reading skills and in using course readings to analyze specific writing techniques and strategies that can be used to improve their own writing.

## **Learning Outcomes**

By the end of this semester, students should be able to demonstrate proficiency in the following aspects:

- 1. Compose essays demonstrating proficiency in developing and organizing ideas, using language effectively;
- 2. Demonstrate continued use and development of effective writing strategies in prewriting, and drafting;
- 3. Write an appropriate introduction, thesis, development and conclusion in an essay.

#### **Content**

Topic 1. Introduction

The students are to know the instructional objectives or goals, contents and schedules, teaching methods and materials of this module.

Topic 2. Written language vs. spoken language

The students learn about the stylistic features of written texts, in lexis, grammar, textural structure, format, etc., in comparison with those of the spoken language.

Topic 3. Exemplary writings of exposition types

The students are exposed to the masterpiece writings of exposition types, including narrative, descriptive, reflective, and analytical essays, to master the key features of each type.

Topic 4. Prewriting – background information

The students learn to examine audiences, purposes and requirements for writing.

Topic 5. Prewriting – research

The students learn to find, evaluate and use sources appropriately.

Topic 6. Prewriting – outlining

The students learn to prepare a writing plan or outline.

Topic 7. Drafting – paragraphs

The students practice on thesis statement and idea generation strategies and techniques, to produce an introduction, thesis, development or conclusion.
