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Description

This First Year Level learning module aims to develop students' general English language proficiency at the intermediate level. Substantial emphasis will be placed on the development of vocabulary and grammatical conventions, general and academic reading, and writing skills. Students' speaking and listening skills are developed through communicative practice activities. Communicative methodologies used are varied and include task-based learning in an attempt to develop the learners' interpersonal skills and activate their ability to use English in social, academic and professional situations.

Learning Outcomes

After completing the learning module, students will be able to:

- 1. Show creativity through communicative tasks and activities; (D4p)
- 2. Demonstrate laboratory skills by using an online e-learning platform; (EP3p)
- 3. Extend vocabulary related to IT and real-life situations in different topics; (EP4p)
- 4. Identify and use communicative skills in reading, writing, listening and speaking; (D4p, D6p, EP4p)

- ♦ Read 1 passage related to real-life situations;
- ♦ Watch 1 video about Steve Job's speech at Stanford University in 2005;
- ♦ Write 2 short passages about their daily activities and the person they admire;
- ♦ Listen to the recordings related to the topics and then be able to give the correct answers
 and interact with other students in communicative practice activities; and
- ♦ Speak and communicate with other students in the activities that required them to prepare and give a group presentation on a given topic.
- 5. Demonstrate competent knowledge of certain grammatical structures in both speaking and writing, namely: (1) Question forms; (2) Present simple and continuous; (3) Comparative and superlative adjectives; (4) Phrases for comparing; (5) Past simple; (6) Present perfect simple; and (7) Present perfect continuous.

Content

- 1. Vocabulary (10 hours)
 - 1.1 Listening

(UNDERSTAND: Students will be able to identify, organize, and outline useful information by listening to various topics.)

1.2 Reading

(COMPREHEND: Students will be able to identify, learn, and apply various vocabulary in relation to different parts of speech by reading various passages related to Everyday activities, Self-introduction and Traveling.)

Practice 1 (4 hours)

- **2.** Grammar (14 hours)
 - 2.1 Question forms;

(MASTER: Students will learn the concept and rules of different Question forms, and demonstrate their proper usage.)

2.2 Comparative and Superlative Adjectives

(MASTER: Students will learn the rules and usage of Comparative and Superlative Adjective, and apply the concept where appropriated.)

2.3 Verb tense forms such as: Present Simple and Continuous; Past simple; Present Perfect Simple and Continuous

(MASTER: Students will learn the rules of verb tenses and demonstrate their proper usage.)

- 3. Presentation skill (8 hours)
 - 3.1 Speaking

(MASTER: Students will be able to choose, organise, and apply the words and phrases related to 'like' and 'dislike', everyday activities, travel and describing places. Design an itinerary and give a presentation regarding an ideal holiday.)

(UNDERSTAND: Students will acquire academic writing skills through lectures on the way you spend your time and the person you admire.)
