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MODULE DESCRIPTION

This is a continuation of English II in which all four macro-skills will be at an upper-intermediate level, with more emphasis given to oral and writing skills. Through theory-based practices, students will be able to read and understand texts on unfamiliar topics, write process-type and argumentative essays in a logical and cohesive way, listen to authentic materials on familiar and unfamiliar topics, and acquire the basic techniques of oral presentation.
