Description

This is a continuation of French II which develops students' language skills. Particular emphasis is placed on listening, and on written and oral expression. Students learn to understand foreign language texts, use the language correctly and confidently, and understand the foreign culture through foreign language learning. Topics include listening, speaking, reading and writing.

Learning Outcomes

After completing the learning module, students will be able to use the French language in:

- 1. Talk about yourself, your educational background, your job, your family, your neighborhood
- 2. Talk about your hobbies and daily activities
- 3. Ask for goods in a shop where goods are displayed
- 4. Order a meal in a restaurant if dishes are either displayed or illustrated on the menu
- 5. Book a hotel room (face to face)
- 6. Ask for basic services in a post office or bank
- 7. Indicate the nature of a medical problem to a doctor

- 8. Make inquiries about a journey at a travel agency
- 9. Use public transport (buses, trains and taxis)
- 10. Ask your way and give directions
- 11. Buy tickets
- 12. Read notices, posters, catalogues, timetables, brochures, menus, advertisements, signs
- 13. Write notes and simple messages
- 14. Note down times, dates and places from notice boards and announcements
- 15. Note down instructions and requests such as client orders and delivery dates.
- 16. Describe events and daily activities

Content

UNDERSTAND: Describe daily activities in the following topics:

- Accommodation: Units in the house, interior decor
- Everyday objects
- Food ingredients, Cooking, Meals, Recipes
- Common animals
- Countries & Cities
- Itinerary, Weather forecast
- Actions in daily life
- Events: Meetings, Evening out, Family events, Visits, Excursions, Accidents, TV news
- Money and payments
- 1.2 Topics

MASTER: Apply correct and appropriate vocabulary in the following topics:

- People: Family, Physical description
- Places: Cafe, Restaurant, Shops, Bank, Post office, Hotel, Road
- Hobbies: Sports, Going out, Shows, Holiday trips
- Public transportation: Subway, Train, Bus, Taxi
- Daily Life: Work, Shopping

2. Grammar (10 hours)

2.1 Grammar I

UNDERSTAND: Define the pronominal verbs: verbes reflechis and pronominal verbs, Interrogative adjective and pronouns, Adjective-position and agreement, Possessive adjective and pronouns, transitive and intransitive verbs: direct and indirect object, Preposition of time: when, while, Preposition of place: to go, be at, come from + a place.

2.2 Grammar II

MASTER: Apply the correct Present Simple Tense: Habit-State, ER, IR, OIR and RE verbs, Common verbs: e.g. come, go, do, know, see, take, Some verbs + infinitive: want to, able

to, can do, Have to + infinitive, Past Simple Tense: events in the past, past participles, Imperfect tense-description in the past (it was, there was), Imperative-Affirmative and Negative-for instruction and command, Near Future Tense, Relative pronouns-who, that/which, Connectors: but, because.

3. Speaking (10 hours)

3.1 Speaking topics I

UNDERSTAND: Define how to ask, follow and give instructions (using Present Tense, Imperative and infinitive), order (food, ingredients, and etc.), book a ticket, cancel an order, do a simple transactions (buy, sell, do a bank transaction), order something and book something, ask to pay, ask or suggest something to somebody, help, a service, an activity, make the necessary arrangements, organize a meeting, offer something,

Describe past activities and personal experiences, daily activities and habits, talk about past events, expression of time: frequency, expression of place: give directions, locate a place/an object/a person, talk about feelings, desvribe a person, his neighbourhood, his monument, a place, common animals, common objects, and lifestyle.

3.2 Speaking topics II

MASTER: Organize sentence in calling out somebody, greeting somebody, taking leave of somebody, welcoming somebody, Congratulate somebody, Give thanks, Introduce somebody, services, suggestions, meeting.

Purpose questions in asking about somebody's news and tell about it, Ask somebody to do something or not to do something, Prohibit from doing something, Ask, give and understand information, accept or refuse something, invite and response to an invitation, apologize and accept apologies, ask somebody to repeat, to clarify, signal to somebody that you can follow what is being said.

3.3 Sociocultural knowledge

UNDERSTAND: Identify every expression to express politeness, welcome somebody: greetings, asking for news, reaction to the response, how to get into a conversation, starting talking, call out somebody and take leave, how to get somebody's attention (Excuse me, Sir \neq Hoy, Hey you there, and etc,), informal conversation, inviting, giving thanks, and apology.

Teaching Method

Lectures, videos, audios, group discussion
