MODULE DESCRIPTION

This 30-hour subject aims to equip students with fundamental theories on life and death, guide students to reflect on life-and-death affairs both for patients and themselves and help them construct a positive and healthy life-and-death attitude.

This subject covers the realistic level of life-and-death affairs, the life-and-death theories in philosophy and religion, and some special topics that would be introduced and discussed, such as abortion, euthanasia, advance care planning, suicide, and organ donation, etc. The course also will teach the techniques of grief counseling and allow students to have the opportunity to practice. Death design will be covered to help students to construct a wise and calm attitude toward their death.

Lecture, discussion, role-playing, video and music appreciation, painting appreciation, and writing/reading guidance will be used as the teaching methods. Assessment includes class performance, reflection papers focusing on any life-and-death topic in this subject, and an open-book exam.
