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MODULE DESCRIPTION

This 30-hour compulsory course aims to facilitate students to obtain a broadened understanding of public health/preventive medicine theory and practice, as well as their relatedness to nursing / medical professionals. The learning is characterized by reviewing most impacting public health issues in the Chinese Mainland and Macao during the past decades, and by eliciting active participation and reflection of students.
