Each assignment activity is graded on a 100-point scale. The final grade will be calculated based on the weighted average of these activities. Assignments must be submitted by the designated deadline. Submissions received after this deadline will have a 10% reduction in total possible points per day of delay (For example, an assignment scored at 80 points, submitted one day late, will be reduced by 8 points to 72 for the final weighted grade.).
