## **MODULE DESCRIPTION**

This module strengthens students' professional English language proficiency at the upper intermediate level. It focuses on the development of vocabulary and professional grammatical conventions, reading, and writing skills in the professional art contexts. Students' language skills are developed through communicative practice activities in arts related discussions such as presentations, proposal writing and conversation role plays. The aim is to cultivate students' ability in professional English.
